Establish a morning and evening routine based on the school start time (7:50 a.m.).


Talk positively to your child about what will happen on the first day of school.


Acknowledge that your child may have a variety of feelings about school.

Watch your emails for a "Popsicles with Principals" event this summer!





















Student Registration

- & Children who reach their fifth birthday on or before Sept. 30 may enter Kindergarten.
- & Registration has started for this coming school year.
- There is no deadline for registration; however, parents are encourage to register early.
- & All registration and health requirements must be met for a child to be admitted.





Where to Register

- The process of registration is done in person (by the parent or legal guardian).
- ## If your child speaks a language other than English as his/her first language, or has been attending an educational system abroad, register your child by contacting the Language Services Registration Center at 703-228-7663.
- In all other cases, register at your neighborhood school, through ParentVUE or at the Welcome Center.
 - The <u>searchable boundary locator</u> can be used to determine your child's neighborhood school for this school year.
